

In the Meadow - Panel Quilt

Quilt Designed by Deb Mosa

Finished Quilt Approx. 34" x 53" - Finished Center Size: 22" x 41"

In the Meadow fabrics by Exclusively Quilters - Style #4100

Fabric Requirements: Based on 42" wide fabric
One **In the Meadow** panel (#61321-9)
3/4 yard grazing sheep (#61322-6)
1/4 yard gray wood (#61323-8)
1-1/4 yards brown wood (#61323-9)
1-3/4 yards backing (meadow #61324-6 suggested)
40" x 60" quilt batting

An added 1/8 to 1/2 yard is added to all yardages to account for shrinkage, straightening, cutting errors and prints that may require special cutting to get the best results.

You should protect your investment in time and fabric by making sample blocks before cutting into your fabric because Exclusively Quilters will take no responsibility for replacing fabrics.

Shops who wish to kit this design are responsible for figuring yardage for their kits if they wish to reduce yardages.

Cutting Directions: All measurements based on a 1/4" seam allowance.

From the **In the Meadow** panel :

Trim panel to 22-1/2" x 41-1/2"

From the **grazing sheep**:

Cut four 4-1/2" strips the **length of fabric, parallel to the selvage**. Sew strips together end to end matching print as much as possible then cut into two 4-1/2" x 43-1/2" side borders

From remaining yardage cut four 4-1/2" x the **remaining width of fabric**. Sew strips together end to end matching print as much as possible then cut into two 4-1/2" x 24-1/2" top and bottom borders

From the **gray wood**:

Cut one 4-1/2" x 42" strip, recut into four 4-1/2" squares

From the **brown wood**:

Cut five 2-1/2" x 42" strips

From remaining yardage (about 3/4 yard) cut eight 1-1/2" strips the **length of fabric, parallel to the selvage**. Sew strips together end to end then cut into two 1-1/2" x 51-1/2" and two 1-1/2" x 41-1/2" side borders

From remaining yardage cut five 1-1/2" x the **remaining width of fabric**. Sew strips together end to end then cut into two 1-1/2" x 34-1/2" and two 1-1/2" x 24-1/2" top and bottom borders

Sewing Directions:

1. Stitch 1-1/2" x 41-1/2" brown wood borders to right and left sides of panel. Add 1-1/2" x 24-1/2" brown wood borders to top and bottom of panel.

2. Stitch 4-1/2" x 43-1/2" grazing sheep borders to right and left sides of quilt. Stitch 4-1/2" gray wood squares to both ends of each 4-1/2" x 24-1/2" grazing sheep borders then add to top and bottom of quilt.

3. Stitch 1-1/2" x 51-1/2" brown wood borders to right and left sides of quilt. Add 1-1/2" x 34-1/2" brown wood borders to top and bottom of quilt.

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Finishing:

1. Layer the backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt or tie as desired. Carefully trim backing and batting even with quilt top.

2. Prepare binding from five 2-1/2" x 42" brown wood strips. Sew strips together into one long binding strip. Press strip in half lengthwise.

3. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to 1/4" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt. Turn binding to back of quilt and blind stitch in place.
